Keynote Speaker: Susan P. Sturm

Susan Sturm is the George M. Jaffin Professor of Law and Social Responsibility and the founding director of the Center for Institutional and Social Change at Columbia Law School.

She has published numerous articles, case studies and books on "the architecture of inclusion," institutional change, transformative leadership, workplace equality, legal education, and inclusion and diversity in higher education.

Her recent publications include: Scaling Up (2010), Negotiating Workplace Equality (2008), Conflict Resolution and Systemic Change (with Howard Gadlin, 2007), and The Architecture of Inclusion: Advancing Workplace Equity in Higher Education (2006).

"The Architecture of Inclusion" was the focus of a symposium issue published in the June 2007 issue of the Harvard Journal of Law and Gender. Sturm is the principal investigator for a Ford Foundation grant awarded to develop the architecture of inclusion in higher education. She has worked with numerous research and educational organizations and networks seeking to build the knowledge and capacity needed to advance full participation and exercise leadership in addressing important problems.

She is currently co-chairing a working group on Transformative Leadership, as part of a Ford Foundation funded project on Building Knowledge for Social Justice. Her research on strategies for facilitating constructive multiracial interaction in police training is featured on the Racetalks website, www.racetalks.org.

Professor Sturm was one of the architects of the national conference on The Future of Diversity and Opportunity in Higher Education. In 2007, she received the Presidential Teaching Award for Outstanding Teaching at Columbia.
